14 January 2024: Succession of the throne

On 14 January 2024, HM The Queen steps down as Queen of Denmark and entrusts the throne to HRH The Crown Prince. The following official events mark the succession of the throne that day.

Accreditation takes place via www.ipcd.dk. The application process for accreditation and pool positions opens on 8 January. Deadline for application is 10 January 10:00 hrs. Allocation of the pool positions is carried out by the Pool Committee on 11 January after which the pool position assignments will be posted on the IPC's website, ipcd.dk.

Please note that access to press pools on 14 January requires accreditation and a pool card issued by IPC.
